Studio Help instructs flow authors at varying levels of programming ability.

The Studio Help system is also available as a PDF document in the HP OO home directory, in the \Studio\docs subdirectory.

Animated tutorials for Central and Studio

HP OO tutorials can each be completed in less than half an hour and provide basic instruction on the following:

- In Studio, modifying flows

### **Overview**

The HP Live Network connector can be used to download and install updated content for your Operations Orchestration system. This can run either automatically, or manually.

The LnC installer and the LnC User's Guide can be found in one of the following folders:

- For Windows, the %OO\_home%\Central\tools\LnC\ folder.
- For Linux, the %iconclude\_home%\tools\LnC\ folder.

The user guide contains platform specific information on how to run the installer.

# Configuring the LnC to Update OO

After you install the LnC, you will need to configure it to update your OO System. To do this run the following commands from the directory in which you installed LnC.

bin\live-network-connector write-config username <LnC Username> password <LnC
Password>

where LnC Username and LnC Password is the username and password of your LnC account.

```
bin\live-network-connector write-config -p oo
```

bin\live-network-connector list-streams lists streams

bin\live-network-connector --set content.oo\_updates=1

bin\live-network-connector --set oo.central\_password=<password>

Where password is the password for the admin user.

bin\live-network-connector --set oo.central\_username=admin

bin\live-network-connector --set oo.home=%iconclude\_home%

Where %iconclude\_home% is the folder in which you installed 00.

bin\live-network-connector --set oo.installed\_version=9.0

If using a custom port:

bin\live-network-connector --set oo.central\_url=https://localhost:<portNumber> where <portNumber> is the number of the port Central is configured to listen to incoming web requests on.

IF you wish to update RASes that are not known by the Central Repository: bin\live-network-connector -set ras\_list=<rasURL1>,<rasURL2>

#### where

- rasURL1 is the URL of the first additional RAS you wish to update
- rasURL2 is the URL of the second.

RASes only need to be added here if they are not listed on the Configuration Items\Remote Action Services list in Studio when connected to the Central Repository.

## **Updating Studio**

The LnC Will only update Central and its known RASes with new content. To use the new content in an OO Studio local repo, you must perform an Update from the Central repository.

# Scheduling Central to Automatically Update Content

It is recommended that OO deployments include two fully independent Central servers. One is production and the other is QA. It is suggested that production flows be test run with new content in QA before updating the content in production. As such, Qa servers can safely be set to automatically update, but production servers should be left manual.

#### To schedule LnC to automatically update your system

- 1. Create a new flow using 1 operation: /Integrations/Hewlett-Packard/Live Network/Download and Import. Set the hpLiveDir input to the directory in which you installed HP Live Network.
- 2. Schedule this flow to run using the OO Scheduler. Each time it runs it will check for OO Content updates on Live Network, and will automatically update them.

### Manually updating content

### To manually update content

1. From the directory in which you installed the LnC run the command: bin\live-network-connector import

This command downloads new content, and update central, its known RASes, and any additional RASes you have configured LnC to update.
