Definitions

Capitalized terms not otherwise defined in this Additional License Authorizations document are defined in the governing Agreement.

Term	Definition
Administrative User	means a specific individual authorized to execute the workflow.
Agent	means that portion of the Software that manages and is required for each physical server, virtual server or container.
Application Deployment Manager / Application Release Management	means the tasks and processes associated with moving an application from development, through testing to production.
Application Server	means software that can be deployed standalone or clustered and has the sole purpose of acting as a container that hosts and executes one or more applications. Application Servers are typically J2EE application servers or. Net application servers.
Client	means any application or systems which provide functionality separate from that of the Software while providing for the facility to connect to and interact with the Software.
Cold Standby System	means a standby non-production system which is NOT up and running. If the production system breaks down, or needs to be taken out of service, Licensee is required to switch on and start the Cold Standby System in order to take over for the production system.
Compliance Management	means the process of proactively establishing and applying compliance policies including patch levels and configuration standards.
Concurrent Users or CC Users	means the Software is licensed by the amount of users that simultaneously use the Software at any one point in time. The Software can be installed on any number of computers, provided that the actual usage of the Software does not exceed the number of licenses purchased.
Connector or Conn	means an integration element to a certain software, format or function through use of the HP Software Product.
Core	means the server side component of software. Is typically complemented by an Agent component

Database	means a container which stores application data including table structure, stored procedures, and other functionality that runs on a Database Instance.
Database Instance	means a software application that has the sole purpose of acting as a container that hosts and executes one or more Databases.
Development and Test Systems	means a non-production system to be used for a) developing Licensee add-on applications in order to access the licensed Software b) migration testing c) pre-production staging or d) version upgrades/configurations and transition purposes.
Device or Dev	means an addressable entity, physical or virtual, including but not limited to router, switch, bridge, hub, server, PC, laptop, handheld device or printer that resides within the range defined for interrogation and asset tracking.
E-LTU and E-Media	means products which are electronically delivered only, and as such any references to FOB Destination or delivery methods that are stated on Your purchase order other than electronic shall be null and void with respect to these E-LTU or E-Media products.
Hot Standby System	means a non-production system which is up and running, ready to take over from the production system if the production system breaks down or needs to be taken out of service.
Instance	means each implementation of the application installed on a Server.
Internal Use	means access and Use of the Software for purposes of supporting the internal operations or functions of Licensee.
LTU	means License To Use.
Managed Entity or Mgd Enti	means an addressable entity such as an operating system, middleware Instance, Database or application as specified in the Software specific license terms below .
Named User or Nmd User	means a specific individual authorized by Licensee to access the Software regardless of whether they are actively using the Software.
Network Automation (NA) Horizontal Scalability	means a meshed Core software installation without database replication.
Network Automation (NA) MultiMaster	means a database & Core standby software installation.
Network Distributed System	means an HP Network Automation installation with multiple Cores that work together in a mesh.
Network Node	means a managed Device (module) that has its own configuration. Note: Network Devices and Nodes are not always the same thing e.g a switch (one Network Device) may have three nodes: one switching card, one routing card and one backup routing card.
Non-Production or NP	means internal use which is limited to Use on Development and Test Systems and Hot and/or Cold Standby Systems. This NP license requires the previous purchase of the equivalent or greater production licenses. Support for NP licenses is restricted to the period of and current status of the equivalent production license.
Non-Production Dev Test or NP DV	means internal use which is limited to Development and Test Systems.
Operating Systems Instance	means each implementation of the bootable program that can be installed onto a physical system or a partition, such as system Virtual Machines, virtual environments, virtual private servers, containers, guests and zones within the physical system. A physical system can contain multiple Operating System Instances. A container means a system partition based on software rather than hardware. Guests means a VM system running on a host system where the host runs its own complete OS Instance (as opposed to a hypervisor), like VMware Workstation. Zone means Oracle ®/Sun Solaris specific nomenclature for a software partition which can run a virtual OS instance including but not limited to Sparse, native, and ipkg.
Orchestrated Node or O-Node	means a node that is managed by an Operations Orchestration workflow that it touches or provides value to as further defined in the Software Specific Terms below.

Term	Definition
PA Device	means a Device, but specifically excluding Network Nodes.
Patching and Provisioning	means the act of applying patches to servers and the process of provisioning software such as operating systems, middleware etc. to physical or Virtual Machines.
Points	means the numerical tracking system representing the total number of metrics Licensee is authorized to execute.
Reported Server Element	means an element under management by Service Automation that is imported into Service Automation Reporter or BSA Essentials.
Reported Non-Server Element	means an element that is either under a Network Automation node or an Application Storage Automation Managed Storage element that is imported into Service Automation Reporter or BSA Essentials.
SA Agent	means an Agent that is designed to interoperate with the Server Automation core.
Satellite	means gateway software that interoperates with a standard Core or a Non-Production Core.
Server	means any designated computer system in which an Instance or Instances of the Software is installed.
Shift User	means a user that has the right to use the product on each of three(3) shifts, It is the equivalent of one(1) shift worker regardless of shift and supports three(3) specific individuals working non-overlapping shifts.
Solution Pack or SolPk	means software that is imported into HP Database & Middleware Automation that provides specific pre-packaged automation capabilities.
Suite	means two or more Software products combined into a single license offering. The specific Software products included in a Suite are specified in the Software Specific License Terms below. Software products included in a Suite are governed by the individual authorizations and use restrictions associated with each Software product.
Universal Agent	means an Agent running on a single Operating System Instance.
Use	means to install, store, load, execute and display once copy of the Software.
Virtual Machine(s) or VM(s)	means a computer that does not physically exist but is simulated by another computer.
Workflow Author Named User	means a specific administrator who is authorized to create and edit process automation workflows.

Software specific license terms

For Software Products with software specific license terms, these terms are described below. Software Products covered by this additional license authorization (as listed on the first page under Product use authorizations) and not covered in this section do not have software specific license terms.

HP BSA Essentials

HP BSA Essentials Connector to BMC Atrium CMDB is licensed per HP BSA Essentials or HP Service Automation Reporter deployment and may only be used to connect to BMC Atrium Configuration Management Databases.

HP Cloud Service Automation Foundation

An HP Cloud Service Automation Foundation Server license entitles the use on 1 logical Cloud Service Automation Foundation system, which could include multiple physical or virtual servers.

HP Cloud Service Automation for Matrix Suite

HP Cloud Service Automation for Matrix Suite (HP CSA for Matrix Suite) builds on top of HP Insight Dynamics to automate the provisioning and monitoring of software running on HP BladeSystem Matrix hardware. CSA for Matrix Suite requires a separate HP Insight Dynamics license in order to operate with HP BladeSystem Matrix hardware. Includes one LTU for HP Cloud Service Automation for Matrix Suite Integration module which provides the ability to integrate the CSA for Matrix Suite with HP Insight Dynamics.

HP Database & Middleware Automation

HP Database & Middleware Automation is licensed per Solution Pack, per Managed Entity:

- For the Database Provisioning Solution Pack and the Application Server Provisioning Solution Pack a Managed Entity is s defined as an Operating System Instance.
- For the Advanced Database Provisioning Solution Pack and the Advanced Database Patching Solution Pack, a Managed Entity is defined as a
 Database Instance.
- For the Database Compliance Solution Pack, a Managed Entity is defined as a Database Instance.
- For the Database Release Management Solution Pack, a Managed Entity is defined as a Database.
- For the Application Server Release Management Solution Pack, a Managed Entity is defined as an Application Server.

HP Network Automation

HP Network Automation is licensed per Network Node per Core.

Network Node Licenses are licensed in 50 Network Node pack bundles. The quantity of HP Network Automation Network Node licenses purchased must be greater than or equal to the number of Network Nodes being managed. Each HP Network Automation Standard Core managing Network Nodes in a production environment must have separate Network Node licenses. There is no license quantity restriction on the number of Network Nodes configurable on a HP Network Automation Standard Core. Consult the HP Network Automation product guide for specific Network Node limits on the product due to hardware capacity constraints.

HP Network Automation Network Node licenses are also licensed in 50 Non-Production Network Node Pack bundles and enable use of both the HP Network Automation MultiMaster and HP Network Automation Horizontal Scalability features. Non-Production Network Node licenses are licensed for a single separate server that is separate from the production version. Non-Production server must have an equal number of non-production network node licenses as the number of production Network Node licenses on a standard Core in order to function. If Non-Production installs of the Software are used in a Network Distributed System, each Server install of the Software must have its own Non-Production or production licenses and all Servers in the Network Distributed System must have an equal number of licenses. Within any Network Distributed System, one Server must have standard Network Node licenses and the other servers in the Network Distributed System must have an equal number of Non-Production licenses for the Network Distributed System to function properly.

Non-Production Dev Test licenses require the previous purchase of the equivalent or greater production licenses. Support for Non-Production Dev Test licenses is restricted to the period of and current status of the equivalent production license. Production and Non-Production Network Node licenses require the use of non-HP third party databases that are not included as part of the Network Node license.

The HP Network Automation Node Pack Non-Production Nodes Software LTU/E-LTU is required to activate the NA Horizontal Scalability capability. The HP Network Automation Node Pack Non-Production Nodes Software LTU/E-LTU is required to activate the NA MultiMaster capability a meshed Core software installation without database replication.

An HP Network Automation Satellite license permits a separate Server and or Device to act as an intermediary point for sending and receiving HP Network Automation traffic to/from Network Nodes to the Core and also adds the ability to handle Network Nodes with duplicate IP addresses. HP Network Automation Satellite must have the same number of Satellite licenses in the production environment as in the Non-Production environments.

HP Network Automation includes a license of HP BSA Essentials. The HP BSA Essentials license can only be used in conjunction with HP Network Automation.

HP Operations Orchestration

When HP Operations Orchestration is licensed by Orchestrated Node, the following applies:

- For HP Operations Orchestration Enterprise Orchestrated Node the Orchestrated Node can represent OS Instances on a physical Device or a Virtual Machine, a physical Device hosting multiple VMs where there are multiple OS Instances, and storage arrays
- For HP Operations Orchestration Network Orchestrated Node the Orchestrated Node can represent network Devices such as a switch, router or hub
- For HP Operations Orchestration Low End Orchestrated Node the Orchestrated Node can represent end user Devices such as Clients, laptops/desktops, handhelds, smart Devices, and SOHO Device such as low cost WiFi routers, switches, cable boxes
- For HP Operations Orchestration CloudFlex 10 Orchestrated Node the Orchestrated Node can represent physical Device or an OS Instance on a physical Device that will host up to 10 VMs.

HP Operation Orchestration Orchestrated Node (O-Node) license includes the core server, central server, remote access server, entire content library, all 3rd party integration components and unlimited users and administrators/authors.

HP Operations Orchestration Platform is only licensed to customers who purchased HP Operations Orchestration Platform prior to September 1, 2011. HP Operation Orchestration Platform license includes the core server, central server, remote access server, entire content library and all 3rd party integration components. HP Operations Orchestration Platform allows software architecture independent of the number of core servers and can be installed on any number of computers, provided that the actual usage of the Software does not exceed the number of licenses purchased as per the Device tier package.

HP Operations Orchestration Platform for Integration Only is only licensed to customers who purchased HP Operations Orchestration Platform for Integration Only prior to September 1, 2011. HP Operations Orchestration Platform for Integration Only license is restricted to integration of HP Server Automation or HP Network Automation with ticketing or monitoring systems, and may not be used for alert/incident resolution automation or other broader Run Book Automation use cases.

HP Server Automation

HP Server Automation includes a license of HP BSA Essentials. The HP BSA Essentials license can only be used in conjunction with HP Server Automation. HP Server Automation Enterprise Plus, Enterprise Edition and Starter Editions require an Oracle database; the license to run Oracle is not included with HP Server Automation. Customers are expected to purchase their license directly from Oracle or to use an existing license.

HP Server Automation Enterprise Plus

HP Server Automation Enterprise Plus is licensed by Operating System Instance. Multi-Master, Satellite and Service Automation Visualizer (SAV) functionality is included in Enterprise Plus. No cap on the number of Enterprise Plus that can be managed outside the number of Enterprise Plus licenses purchased and no restriction on functionality within the product that can be used.

HP Server Automation Starter Edition for Patching and Provisioning

Entry level HP Server Automation package which can be used in environments with up to 1000 Operating System Instances for the purpose of Patching and Provisioning including operating systems and applications. Customers are entitled to use other basic features such as global shell, baseline, and security features.

HP Server Automation Enterprise Edition

HP Server Automation Enterprise Edition is only licensed to customers who purchased HP Server Automation Enterprise Edition prior to September 1, 2011. No cap on the number of Enterprise Edition that can be managed outside the number of Enterprise Edition licenses purchased and no restriction on functionality within the product that can be used.

HP Server Automation Starter Edition for Compliance Management

HP Server Automation Starter Edition for Compliance Management is only licensed to customers who purchased HP Server Automation Starter Edition for Compliance Management prior to September 1, 2011. HP Server Automation Starter Edition for Compliance Management is an entry level HP Server Automation package which can be used in environments with up to 1000 Operating System Instances for the purpose of Compliance Management. Users are not entitled to perform Provisioning functions. Customers are entitled to use other basic features such as global shell, baseline, and security features.

HP Application Deployment Manager

(previously called HP Server Automation Starter Edition for Application Deployment Manager and HP Server Automation Starter Edition for Application Release Manager)

HP Application Deployment Manager is only licensed to customers who purchased HP Application Deployment Manager prior to September 1, 2011. HP Application Deployment Manager is a HP Server Automation edition with limited HP Operations Orchestration bundling which can be used for the purpose of Application Deployment Management. Administrative Users are entitled to use the lowest tier of HP Operations Orchestration, which is limited to 150 Devices, 1 Concurrent User and 1 Workflow Author User licenses.
