1 Upgrading the HP Client Automation Administrator

Upgrade Instructions

To upgrade the HPCA Administrator for Windows

- Install the new HPCA Administrator by running `setup.exe` from `rsc_infra\management_infrastructure\administrator_workstation\win32` directory on the HP Client Automation installation media.

The existing HPCA Administrator files are replaced during the new installation. You do not need to remove these files prior to installation.

Note that if you remove the previous Administrator, and then run the `setup.exe`, the HPCA Administrator will install to the default directory, `\Program Files\Hewlett-Packard\CM\Agent`.

See the *Administrator for Windows* chapter in the *HPCA Administrator User Guide* for detailed information about how to use the installation.

To upgrade the HPCA Administrator for Linux

- Install the new HPCA Administrator using `./install` from the correct operating system-specific directory in the

`rsc_infra/management_infrastructure/administrator_workstation`

directory on the HP Client Automation installation media.

For example, for Red Hat Linux, use the installation media located in:

`rsc_infra/management_infrastructure/administrator_workstation/linux`

The existing HPCA Administrator files are replaced during the new installation. You do not need to remove these files prior to installation.

Note that if you remove the previous Administrator, and then run the `setup.exe`, the HPCA Administrator will install to the default directory, `/opt/HP/CM/Agent`.
