## Release 1.2 SP1

This package contains Release 1.2 SP1 of the Get.It! Suite. This release booklet provides an overview of the items in the release.

### Items Included

Your complete Get.It! Release 1.2 SP1 package includes:

- A CD including Get.It! Release 1.2 SP1
- Release Notes
- Documentation, including:

### Features In Release 1.2 SP1

Release 1.2 SP1 includes the localization of Get.It! and other enhancements. These features, and the others provided in this release are briefly described below. You can find more details about these changes in the accompanying Get.It! manuals.

#### Internationalization for Windows NT

Get.It! for Windows NT is now localized for English, French, and German.

When a user logs into Get.It!, the login programs detect the preferred language set in the browser and determine if the user's language is supported by Get.It! If the language is supported Get.It! will be displayed in that language.

If the language is not supported, the default language is used. The default language is set in the Archway.ini file through the Locale field in the Administration Module Settings. The first entry in this field is the default language.

If you chose to install multiple languages (during the Get.It! Installation Procedure), the Get.It! Login window includes a select box with a list of the installed languages. When the user selects a language, the Login window is redisplayed with the chosen language.

All window content will be displayed in the language chosen by the user. The only exception is if the back-end system is not capable of supplying translated versions of the data, then the data will still display in the language of that back-end system.



## Release 1.2 SP1

All dates and currency are displayed and edited in the user's language. The formatting is done when the weblication <field> or <input> tags have a type attribute equal to "date" or "currency." Calendars display the translated weekday name and start the week on the user locale's first day of the week.

Currency is displayed using the correct symbol and decimal indicator, however, the decimal point and the thousands separator are determined by the user's preferred language and not the currency being displayed. For example, a French speaking user will see US dollars as \$1 234,00, a German speaking user will see \$1.234,00, and an English speaking user will see \$1,234.00.

If you have tailored Get.It! and want the tailored portions to display in languages you will need to follow the instructions in the "Localization Support" chapter of the *Get.It! Tailoring Guide*.

We are not providing translated AssetCenter demonstration databases. You will need to ensure that your workflows are customized to fit your business rules and naming requirements.

### Changes to the archway.ini File

The archway.ini file has been expanded quite a bit in Release 1.2 SP1. Below is a list of the new fields added to the archway.ini file.

Field	Change or New	Description
locale	New field	Specify language you want to be available to the users. For example, for English, French, and German language support, the entry will appear as en, fr, de. The first language entered will be considered the default.

Field	Change or New	Description
currency	New field	<p>If you are using a currency other than U.S. Dollars, specify semicolon delimited list of applicable ISO-4217 currency codes.</p> <p>If you use the B2B module, all items on each order must be in the same currency. For example, if the first item ordered is in US dollars, all items in that order must be in US dollars.</p>
resolveAppStrings	New field	<p>If you are using a language other than English, you must extract all relevant strings using the <code>strbuild</code> command. This extracts all English strings and maps to untranslated strings in <code>*.str</code> files.</p> <p>Set this field to True to have Get.It! create the French and German <code>*str</code> files. Set it to False to have Get.It! create only the English string file.</p>

## Weblication DTDs

There are two new entries in the Get.It! Tailoring guide: `<input>` (date) and `<input>` (money). The Date field produces a drop-down list box containing month, day, and year. The Money field produces a drop-down list box displaying currency as defined within the Currency property of the `archway.ini` file.

When using the `<field>` element and table `<columns>` elements in weblication you can now include a type. Options for the type are:

- date = show the date
- datetime = show the date and time
- money = show the field as a money field
- timespan = show the span of elapsed time

## Solaris Changes

If you are a Solaris user there are two changes that you should consider. The first is regarding the original `getit.xml` file. This file is copied and renamed `getservice.xml`. Solaris users should use the `getservice.xml` file because it does not contain Windows NT-specific packages.

When using the `wbuild` command, type `wbuild.sh getservice`. This changes the `weblica-`  
`tion` parameter within the `archway.ini` file to `weblication:getservice.xml`.

## JRun (Solaris)

If you are a Solaris user implementing the SC Adapter you should manually stop and restart JRun. Do not use the Reset Server button, located within the Admin module.

## Netscape Users

Regardless of the currency you select, you must enter a decimal point as a period instead of a comma.
