WinRunner NatStar/NSDK Add-in Installation Guide, Version 7.0

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Before You Install

Welcome to the NatStar/NSDK Add-in for WinRunner 7.0. The NatStar/NSDK Add-in enables you to record, program, and run Context Sensitive user operations on NatStar/NSDK objects.

This guide describes how to install Add-in support for NatStar/NSDK objects.

Before you begin to install the NatStar/NSDK Add-in, please review the following pre-installation procedures.

System Requirements

To successfully run WinRunner with the NatStar/NSDK Add-in, you need the following minimum system requirements:

Platform	An IBM-PC or compatible with a Pentium® /100MHz or higher microprocessor.
Memory	32 MB of RAM memory.
Operating System	Windows 95, Windows 98, Windows NT 4.0, Windows 2000, or Windows Me.
Prerequisites	WinRunner 7.0 standalone installation.
NatStar/NSDK Environment	NatStar 2.10 / NSDK 1.54 or higher.

Installing NatStar/NSDK Add-in Support

The installation process for NatStar/NSDK Add-in support is comprised of three stages:

- Installing the WinRunner NatStar/NSDK Add-in
- Setting-up NatStar/NSDK Add-in Support
- Activating NatStar/NSDK Add-in Support


Installing the WinRunner NatStar/NSDK Add-in

The NatStar/NSDK Add-in setup program installs the NatStar/NSDK Add-in in your WinRunner installation folder.

To install NatStar/NSDK Add-in support:

- 1** Insert the CD-ROM into the drive from which you want to install. If you are installing from a network drive, connect to it.
- 2** Select **Run** on the **Start** menu.
- 3** Type the location from which you are installing, and `setup.exe`. For example, type `d:\setup.exe`.
- 4** Click **OK**. The NatStar/NSDK add-in support setup begins. Follow the instructions in the setup program.

- 5** In the **Registration Information** screen, type your name, the name of your company, and a WinRunner maintenance number. This number can be found in the Maintenance Pack Number envelope or on the bill of lading you received when you purchased WinRunner. Note that there is a single maintenance number for each team of users. (The maintenance number replaces what was formerly a serial number for each purchased copy of WinRunner.) The maintenance number identifies the customer.

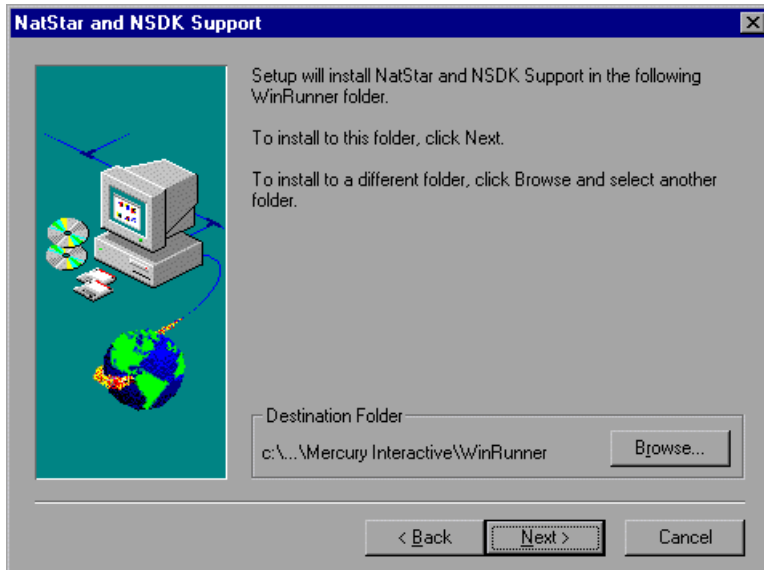

Click **Next**.

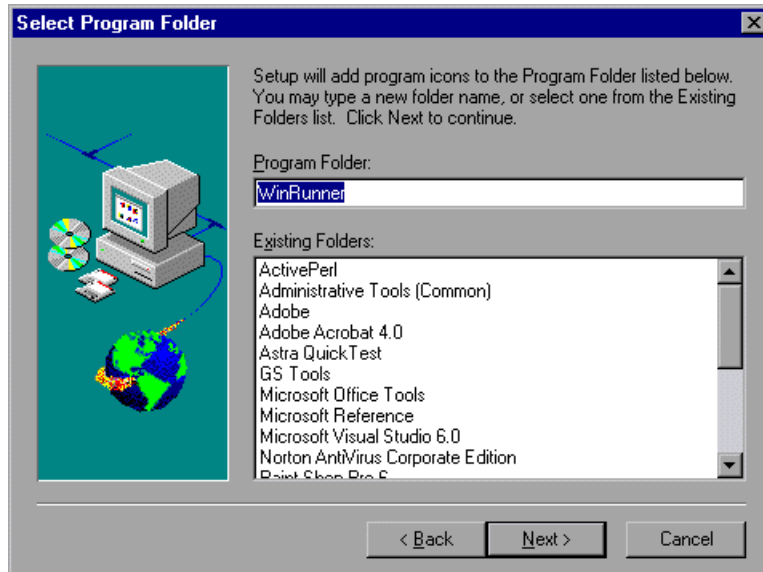
- 6** Click **Yes** to confirm the registration information.

- 7 Specify the folder in which to install the NatStar/NSDK Add-in. The destination folder must be the WinRunner installation folder. If the installation folder that appears is not the WinRunner installation folder, click **Browse** to find the correct destination folder.



Click **Next**.

- 8 Select the program folder for the NatStar/NSDK Add-in icons.



Click **Next**. The installation process begins. To pause or quit the installation, click **Cancel**.

- 9 The NatStar/NSDK Add-in Installation is complete. To read what's new in the Add-in support for NatStar/NSDK, and any last minute information, select the **Yes, I want to view the Read Me File** check box.

Click **Finish**. It is recommended to restart your computer.

Setting-up NatStar/NSDK Add-in Support

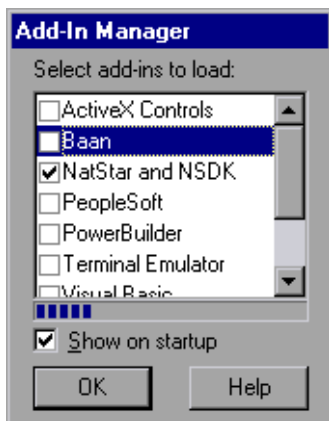
To test NatStar/NSDK applications, you must copy *nsdktapi.dll* and *nsw2cust.dll* (*nsw2cust.dll* - if it does not already exist in a folder which is in the system path) from your *<WinRunner installation folder>\arch* folder to a NatStar/NSDK folder that is in the system path, e.g. your *<NatStar installation folder>\bin* folder or to your *<NatStar installation folder>\dll* folder.

Activating NatStar/NSDK Add-in Support

You are now ready to create and run tests on NatStar/NSDK applications.



To start WinRunner with support for NatStar/NSDK applications, select **Programs > WinRunner > WinRunner** from the **Start** menu. The Add-in Manager dialog box opens. Select **NatStar and NSDK** and click **OK**. (If the Add-In Manager dialog box does not open, see the note below.)



For more information about the Add-in Manager, please refer to the *WinRunner User's Guide*.

Note:

If the Add-In Manager dialog box does not open:

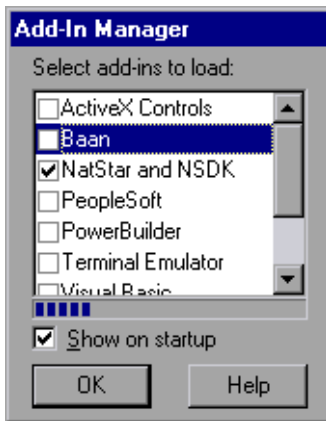
- 1** Start WinRunner.
 - 2** Choose **Settings > Options** and click the **Environment** tab. Select **Show Add-in Manager dialog for ___ seconds** and fill in a comfortable amount of time in seconds. (The default value is 10 seconds.)
 - 3** Click **OK**.
 - 4** Close WinRunner. A WinRunner Message dialog prompts you to save changes made in the configuration. Click **Yes**.
 - 5** Open WinRunner again and proceed from “Activating NatStar/NSDK Add-in Support” above.

Disabling NatStar/NSDK Add-in Support

If you decide not to use NatStar/NSDK support, you can disable the NatStar/NSDK add-in.

To disable the add-in support:

- 1** Select **Programs > WinRunner > WinRunner** from the **Start** menu to open WinRunner.
- 2** After the opening screen appears, the Add-In Manager dialog box opens for ten seconds. (If the Add-In Manager dialog box does not open, see the note below.)



To disable NatStar/NSDK support, clear the **NatStar and NSDK** check box.

- 3** Click **OK**. WinRunner opens with the NatStar/NSDK add-in support disabled.

Note:

If the Add-In Manager dialog box does not open:

- 1** Start WinRunner.
 - 2** Choose **Settings > Options** and click the **Environment** tab. Select **Show Add-in Manager dialog for ___ seconds** and fill in a comfortable amount of time in seconds. (The default value is 10 seconds.)
 - 3** Click **OK**.
 - 4** Close WinRunner. A WinRunner Message dialog prompts you to save changes made in the configuration. Click **Yes**.
 - 5** Open WinRunner again and proceed from Step 2 in “To disable the add-in support,” above.
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
