What's New in this Release?

This section describes the new features included in HP Anywhere 10.01.

Black/White List Functionality

HP Anywhere 10.01 enables administrators to allow or prevent specific users and/or devices from accessing HP Anywhere. You can create:

- White lists to allow only specific users and/or devices to connect to HP Anywhere.
- Black lists to prevent specific users and/or devices from connecting to HP Anywhere.

Smartphone

- Developers can relate business entities to an activity upon a user post.
- Developers can provide a specific app page to an activity upon a user post.
- Developers can dynamically hide and show the activity actions toolbar.
- Developers can dynamically replace the activity actions toolbar with a text string.
- Developers can dynamically add one additional button to the activity actions toolbar.
- Developers can add additional options to the activity More menu .
- Developers can customize an app to open directly upon login to HP Anywhere.
- End users receive a message when they post to the timeline, or when a new business entity or app page is added to the activity.
- When an end user selects Apps from the More menu, a union of All and Recommended apps is shown.

Tablet

- When logging in to HP Anywhere, end users see the **My Apps** page.
- End users can set the landing page to be **My Apps** or **Front Page**.
- End users can see the number of unread **Front Page** activities from **My Apps**.
- End users receive a message when a new business entity or an app page is added to the activity.

- Developers can relate business entities to an activity upon a user post.
- Developers can provide a specific app page to an activity upon a user post.

Desktop

- End users receive a message when a new business entity or app page is added to the activity.
- Developers can relate business entities to an activity upon a user post.
- Developers can provide a specific app page to an activity upon a user post.
- End users can set the landing page to be **My Apps** or **Front Page**.
- End users can see the number of unread **Front Page** activities from **My Apps**.

Open Defects

The reference number for each defect is the change request (QCCR) number. For more information about open defects, visit [HP Software Support Online](#), or contact your HP Support representative directly.

Title: Tomcat - When an app has two data sources, it cannot connect to the backend. (QCCR150158)

Description: The information in the Data Source tab for the app should be read only in a SaaS environment. In a mobility environment, the Add Data Source button should be disabled if a data source already exists.

Workaround: Return the first instance in the list if no instance name is provided.

Title: Desktop - Firefox - Help topics do not appear when clicking Help. (QCCR1A156805)

Description: When running HP Anywhere in Mozilla Firefox, help topics do not open when you click on the ? icon.

Workaround: Run HP Anywhere using Microsoft Internet Explorer or Google Chrome.

Title: HP Anywhere 10.00 IE8 & IE9 - Unable to upload apps in the Administrator Console. (QCCR157201)

Description: When running HP Anywhere in Internet Explorer 8 or 9, you cannot upload apps to the Administrator Console.

Title: HP Anywhere tablet version (iPad 3): HP Anywhere crashes when you try to load more than four entry points or when using the Snapshot functionality. (QCCR157970)

Description: When you try to create more than four entry points for an app, and move from one to another, HP Anywhere crashes. This also occurs when using the Snapshot functionality when HP Anywhere uploads an app.

Title: HPA 10.01. App deployment. After redeploying an app, changes in the translation files only take effect after restarting HP Anywhere (QCCR160378)

Description: After redeploying an app, changes in the translation files only take effect after restarting HP Anywhere.

Title: Smartphone: Activities marked for a group operation are unchecked when the user moves to a different page and returns. (QCCR161586)

Description: After the user selects several activities in order to perform a group operation, moves to a different page and then returns, the selected activities are unchecked.

Fixed Defects in this Release

The following defects have been fixed in HP Anywhere 10.01:

- **iOS devices:** Reinstall of a native client requires the reinstallation of all the apps on the user device. (QCCR157049)
- JQuery apps are not supported. (QCCR158189)
- **Desktop:** After viewing the search results, you need to refresh the page. (QCCR158561)

Limitations

- Smartphone Android - The keyboard on the login page hides the input fields.
- Smartphone - Archiving more than 7 activities in a bulk operation does not succeed.
- Android Tablet is not certified and not recommended for use.
- Desktop – After viewing the search results, you need to refresh the page.

Developers Only:

- Only single page apps (SPAs) are supported.

Administrators Only:

- You cannot install HP Anywhere in a folder whose name contain spaces.
- In Internet Explorer 9, you cannot upload an app via the Administrator Console .
Workaround: Use any other supported browser.
- Modifications applied to email templates in previous versions of HP Anywhere are lost when upgrading to a new version.
Workaround: After upgrading, restore your customized email templates from the backup created by HP Anywhere from:
<HP_Anywhere_installation_folder>\Installation\HPAW1001\backup
