New Features in this Release

- **Remove All Apps.** You can now restore your local HP Anywhere server to its initial state and uninstall all apps along with their configurations. This is supported from the Eclipse IDE, using the **Remove All Apps** context menu command or toolbar button.
- **Simulate Offline for App Development.** If your apps support offline usage, you can now test this via HP Anywhere Simulator. This enables you to verify that your apps work correctly when there is no Internet connection. The Simulator contains a drop-down list that enables you to switch between online and offline.
- **Simulate the Android Back Button.** HP Anywhere Simulator now enables you to simulate tapping the back button on an Android smartphone.
- **Learn How to Develop Apps.** The Eclipse IDEs now includes a link to a Web page that provides information on how to develop new apps. You can download various cookbooks and app code samples, access the HP Anywhere API Reference and Developer Zone, and connect to the HP Anywhere Community.
- **Test Brand Identity Support from Your IDE.** If you modify the default HP Anywhere logo, brand name, and theme color (via the Administrator Console) to match your brand identity, you can test these changes from within the IDE. For details, see the *HP Anywhere Administrator Guide*.
- **New AngularJS Templates.** You can now use out-of-the-box AngularJS templates to create apps.
- **Defect Fixes.** This version includes multiple defect fixes for improved usability.
