## Chapter 2: System Requirements

- This language pack can be deployed on a new or upgraded instance of PPM Center version 9.30.
- Set the following Oracle database properties in addition to the standard PPM settings:
  - NLS\_LENGTH SEMANTICS = CHAR
  - NLS\_CHARACTERSET = AL32UTF8
  - NLS\_NCHAR\_CHARACTERSET = AL16UTF16

## Chapter 3: Installation Notes

Installation instructions are provided in the following section, "[Installing the Language Pack Software](#)" on [page 8](#). Before you install the language pack, note the following:

- You must install PPM Center version 9.30 prior to installing the Language Pack software.
- Graphs and Charts configuration

The `arialuni.ttf` file must be added to the `<JAVA_HOME>/jre/lib/fonts/fallback` folder of the PPM Server.

**Note:** The font can be purchased from Microsoft (<http://www.microsoft.com/typography/fonts/font.aspx?fmid=1081>).

- Fiscal Periods Localization

To localize existing fiscal periods, run the following command from `<PPM_Home>/bin` folder to commit or with `all` flag to generate translation for all LPs:

```
sh ./kGenFiscalPeriods.sh -language <LP> commit
```

where `<LP>` represents the language codes for a supported language.

Or,

```
sh ./kGenFiscalPeriods.sh -language all commit
```

## Chapter 4: Installing the Language Pack Software

See the *Release Notes* for PPM Center version 9.30 for details about installing PPM Center version 9.30. If you are upgrading from version 9.20 or earlier, see the *Upgrade Guide*. You can install the Language Pack after you have installed or upgraded your instance.

**IMPORTANT:** Your installation steps may differ depending on whether you have PPM Center Best Practices installed and whether you are upgrading from PPM Center version 9.22 Language Pack. Follow the steps in the section below that applies to your situation.

- **If you already have a translated version of Best Practices installed (because you installed version 9.22 Language Pack previously), follow these steps after you've upgraded to PPM Center version 9.30.**
  - a. Stop the PPM\_Server\_Name.
  - b. Using a console for UNIX or Cygwin for Windows, navigate to the <PPM\_Home>/bin directory.
  - c. Run the kDeploy script as follows: `sh ./kDeploy.sh -lang <Locale>`
  - d. Follow the on-screen instructions.
  - e. Restart the PPM Server using `kStart.sh`.
- **If you have installed PPM Center version 9.30 and you do not have Best Practices installed, deploy the language pack software. For detailed instructions, see the *Installation and Administration Guide*.**
- **If you have an English-language version of Best Practices installed and you have upgraded to PPM Center version 9.30, install the language pack directly.**
- **If you deploy the language pack on a cluster, make sure to deploy the language pack on all nodes in the cluster.**

## Importing Default Translations

After you have completed all tasks you need to perform after language deployment, import the default translations for the basic configurations that HP provides in your new PPM Center installation.

To do so, run the following command for each language deployed on your PPM Center instance:

```
sh. /kImportAttributes.sh -username admin -password admin -directory <PPM_Home>/m1u/HPContentTranslations/<LP>
```

where <LP> represents the code for a supported language.



**Tip:** To make this process easier, you may do the follows:

1. Copy the content (zip archives) from each Language Pack to the <PPM\_Home>/mlu/translations folder.
2. Run the following command:

```
sh ./kImportAttributes.sh -username admin -password admin
```

This command automatically imports all files from translations folder to PPM Server.
