Mitigation

To make sure that the Shell Shock Linux Bash defect will not affect your **HP Propel** systems complete the steps in the following sections for both the **HP Propel Portal** and the **HP Propel Service eXchange (SX)** systems.

Machines connected to the Internet

- Run the following command in order to update the Bash: yum update bash (must be a root user or SUDO).
- 2. View the version of the Bash again to see that the update was successful: rpm q bash It should be: bash-4.1.2-15.el6 5.2.x86 64

Machines not connected to the Internet:

1. Search and download from a machine connected to the Internet the following Bash package: bash-4.1.2-15.e16 5.2.x86 64

To download go to:

http://mirror.centos.org/centos/6/updates/x86_64/Packages/bash-4.1.2-15.el6_5.2.x86_64.rpm

- 2. Copy the package to both **HP Propel** machines (Portal and Service eXchange).
- 3. Run the update Bash command: rpm -U bash-4.1.2-15.el6 5.2.x86 64.rpm
- 4. View the version of the Bash again to see that the update was successful: rpm q bash It should be: bash-4.1.2-15.el6 5.2.x86 64
