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# Suppliers

# Concepts

An HP Propel *supplier* consists of an end-point system and its properties to enable integration with HP Propel. Examples of suppliers are:

- Provider systems
- · Fulfillment systems
- · Ticketing systems

For example, an HP Propel supplier can be added for an HP Service Manager system, and then the supplier's support requests can be imported into HP Propel.

Suppliers are associated with organizations, and the Organization Administrator manages the supplier systems for his organization.

# View Supplier Details

## Concepts

#### View Supplier Overview

To view the supplier overview:

- From the Launchpad in HP Propel, click the Suppliers application. The Suppliers view is displayed.
- 2. Click the supplier in the main list. The details of the supplier are displayed in the **Overview** view.

## View Supplier Diagnostics

To view the diagnostics for a supplier:

 From the Launchpad in HP Propel, click the Suppliers application. The Suppliers view is displayed.

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- 2. Click the supplier in the main list.
- 3. In the Supplier Detail view, click the Diagnostics tab. The status of the supplier is displayed.

You can also view additional metrics, such as response time.

#### View Supplier Configuration Check

**Note**: The **Configuration Check** tab is available only for certain suppliers, such as HP Service Manager and HP Service Anywhere.

To view the status of HP SM unload files for a supplier:

- From the Launchpad in HP Propel, click the Suppliers application. The Suppliers view is displayed.
- 2. Click the supplier in the main list.
- In the Supplier Detail view, click the Configuration Check tab. The status of all HP SM unload files for the supplier are displayed

# Add Supplier

### Concepts

Suppliers represent end-point systems that are integrated with HP Propel. Examples of HP Propel suppliers are: provider systems, fulfillment systems, and ticketing systems.

Suppliers are associated with organizations, and the Organization Administrator manages the supplier systems for his organization.

The Organization Administrator can create new suppliers in HP Propel.

#### Tasks

To create a new supplier:

- 1. From the Launchpad in HP Propel, click the Suppliers application.
- 2. In the Suppliers view, click Add Supplier.
- 3. In the Add Supplier dialog, fill in and select the Basic Supplier Properties:

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- a. Type the Name of the new supplier.
- b. Select the Backend System Type.
- 4. After the **Backend System Type** is selected, additional **General** fields are displayed, such as integration account credentials and end-point URLs. Fill in and select the required **General** fields.
- 5. Click **Create** in the **Add Supplier** dialog to finish and save your changes. The new supplier and its properties are displayed.
- 6. Optional, only for HP SM suppliers if an HP SM supplier has been added and LWSSO has been specified, see "Configure LWSSO" on page 9 for instructions.

**Important**: If HTTPS is used for communication between HP Propel and the new supplier, then HTTPS must be configured. See "Configure SSL for a Supplier" below for instructions.

## Configure SSL for a Supplier

If HTTPS is used for communication between HP Propel and a supplier, then HTTPS must be configured.

### Configure SSL

Perform the following steps.

- 1. Import the HP Propel VM's CA-signed certificate into the supplier's keystore. The general steps to do this are:
  - a. Copy the HP Propel VM's /opt/hp/propel/security/CA.crt file to the supplier's /tmp directory.
  - b. On the supplier's system, import the CA-signed certificate:

```
# keytool -importcert -file /tmp/CA.crt -alias Propel_CA
-trustcacerts -keystore <SUPPLIER-KEYSTORE-PATH>/cacerts
```

Where SUPPLIER-KEYSTORE-PATH is the location of the cacerts file on the supplier's system. Examples of cacerts file locations are:

- HP SM on Windows:
  - C:\Program Files (x86)\HP\ServiceManager9.X\Server\RUN\cacerts
- HP SM on Linux: /opt/HP/ServiceManager9.X/Server/RUN
- HP CSA on Windows:
  - C:\Program Files\Hewlett-Packard\CSA\openjre\lib\security\cacerts

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HP CSA on Linux:

/usr/local/hp/csa/openjre/lib/security/cacerts

c. On the supplier's system, restart the supplier's services:

```
For HP SM: # service sm restart
For HP CSA: # service csa restart
```

- 2. Import the supplier's CA certificate into the HP Propel VM's truststore. The general steps to do this are:
  - a. Obtain the supplier's CA certificate, and then copy it to the HP Propel VM's /tmp directory. For examples of obtaining a supplier's certificate, see "SSL Tips" below. In the following step, the supplier's CA certificate is in a CA.crt file.
  - b. On the HP Propel VM, import the supplier's CA-signed certificate:

```
# keytool -importcert -file /tmp/CA.crt -alias Supplier_CA
-trustcacerts -keystore /opt/hp/propel/security/propel.truststore
```

(The default password is "propel2014" for the HP Propel truststore.)

3. On the HP Propel VM, restart the HP Propel Service Exchange services:

```
# systemctl restart jetty-sx
```

**Tip**: To verify that HTTPS is correctly configured between HP Propel and the supplier, view the supplier details in the **Suppliers** application, and then click the **Diagnostics** tab. The status should indicate there are no connection issues.

#### SSL Tips

If you do not have an SSL certificate from the supplier's system, you can manually create a certificate. Examples of creating a supplier's SSL certificate are:

- "Export SSL Certificate from Supplier's Truststore" below
- "Create Supplier's Host Certificate" below

### Export SSL Certificate from Supplier's Truststore

Use the following command on the supplier's system to export an SSL certificate from the supplier's truststore:

```
# keytool -exportcert -file <CERT-OUTPUT-FILE> -keystore
<SUPPLIER-KEYSTORE-PATH>/cacerts -alias <SUPPLIER-ALIAS>
```

#### Where::

- CERT-OUTPUT-FILE is the output file that will contain the exported certificate.
- SUPPLIER-KEYSTORE-PATH is the location of the cacerts file on the supplier's system.
- SUPPLIER-ALIAS is the alias used in the supplier's truststore to identify the supplier's certificate.

## Create Supplier's Host Certificate

Use the following procedure to create a supplier's host certificate:

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1. On the HP Propel VM, execute the following command:

```
# openssl s_client -connect <SUPPLIER-HOST>:<PORt> > supplier.crt
```

2. Edit the supplier.crt file and retain only the lines beginning with "----BEGIN CERTIFICATE-----" and ending with "-----END CERTIFICATE-----", deleting all other lines.

You can verify that the supplier's host certificate is valid with the following command:

```
# keytool -printcert -file supplier.crt
```

The output of the keytool command should identify the certificate owner and issuer.

## Configure LWSSO

If an HP SM supplier has been added to HP Propel and LWSSO has been specified, to enable the LWSSO communication, the /opt/hp/propel/sx/WEB-INF/classes/config/lwssofmconf.xml file must contain the proper LWSSO configuration that matches the target HP SM instance. In particular:

- The domain element must contain the common domain for HP SX and the target HP SM instance.
- The initString attribute of the crypto element must contain the same passphrase as the HP SM instance.

After changes have been made to the lwssofmconf.xml file, the following must be done:

1. Restart HP SX on the HP Propel VM:

```
# systemctl restart jetty-sx
```

- 2. On the HP SM system:
  - a. Make similar revisions to the <SM\_SERVER\_INSTALL\_PATH>/RUN/lwssofmconf.xml file.
  - b. Restart HP SM (# service sm restart).

To revise a supplier's properties:

- 1. From the Launchpad in HP Propel, click the **Suppliers** application. The **Suppliers** view is displayed.
- Click the supplier that you want to edit. The details of the supplier are displayed.

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- 3. Click Edit. The Supplier Details dialog is displayed.
- 4. Type or select new values for the supplier's properties that you want revised.
- 5. Click **Save** in the **Supplier Details** dialog to finish and save your changes.

The revisions for the supplier's properties are displayed.

# Synchronize Support Requests

## Concepts

Suppliers represent end-point systems that are integrated with HP Propel. Examples of HP Propel suppliers are: provider systems, fulfillment systems, and ticketing systems.

Suppliers are associated with organizations, and the Organization Administrator manages the supplier systems for his organization.

The Organization Administrator can import support requests into HP Propel from a supplier, such as HP Service Manager.

#### Tasks

**Note**: The **Synchronize support requests** feature is available for only certain suppliers, such as HP SM and HP Service Anywhere.

To import a supplier's support requests into HP Propel:

- 1. From the Launchpad in HP Propel, click the **Suppliers** application. The **Suppliers** view is displayed.
- Click the supplier from which you want to import support requests. The details of the supplier are displayed.
- 3. In the Supplier Detail view, click  $\mathring{\cdot}$  and select Synchronize support requests.
- 4. In the **Synchronize support requests** dialog, specify the **Start date**, which is the beginning date to import support requests from the supplier, and then click **Execute synchronization**.

All support requests, starting from the **Start date**, are imported into HP Propel.

# Delete Supplier

## Concepts

Suppliers represent end-point systems that are integrated with HP Propel. Examples of HP Propel suppliers are: provider systems, fulfillment systems, and ticketing systems.

Suppliers are associated with organizations, and the Organization Administrator manages the supplier systems for his organization.

The Organization Administrator can delete suppliers in HP Propel.

#### Tasks

To delete a supplier:

- From the Launchpad in HP Propel, click the Suppliers application. The Suppliers view is displayed.
- 2. In the **Suppliers** view, click the supplier you want to remove.
- 3. In the **Supplier Detail** view, click and select **Remove**. A confirmation dialog to delete the supplier is displayed.
- 4. Confirm the supplier deletion, and the supplier is deleted from HP Propel.

Caution: If a supplier is deleted, then all of its aggregations and catalog items are also deleted.
