

Accessing the Interactive Installation Guide

To access the HP Network Node Manager i Software Interactive Installation Guide, follow these steps:

1. On the product media, go to the top-level or root directory.
2. Extract one of the following files:
`nnmi_interactive_installation_en.zip`
3. Double-click `interactive_installation_upgrade_guide_en.htm`
4. The NNMi Interactive Installation Guide enables you to select the installation or uninstallation options for your network environment. Select each option that applies.


NNMi provides two installation methods:

If you have a PDF print driver installed on your computer, click Print to create PDF documents that are customized according to your selections. PDF print drivers are available from several open source and third-party providers.

Tip: After you click **View** or **Print**, you can change your selections by clicking **Change** in the displayed document.

Note: While viewing the resulting document, use the check box in each section heading to collapse a section.

6. Use these results as your customized NNMi Installation Guide.
7. Using the information in this guide, install the product.

To be able to view reports built with the data collected by NNMi and NNMi Smart Plug-ins, you need to install the Network Performance Server (NPS) and NNM iSPI Performance for Metrics after completing the NNMi installation.
