3. **HPE Network Node Manager i Software Interactive Installation Guide**—provides customizable instructions to help you install NNMi. Read this document to become familiar with the details and requirements associated with the installation process.
4. The “Preparation” section of the **HPE Network Node Manager i Software Deployment Reference**—includes information to review before beginning the NNMi installation.

After you have read the documents listed above, you are ready to begin the installation process.

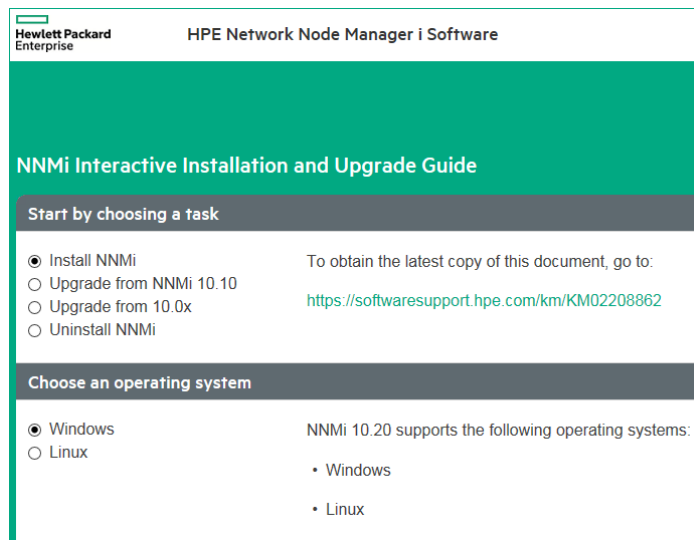

## Accessing the Interactive Installation Guide

To access the HPE Network Node Manager i Software Interactive Installation Guide, follow these steps:

1. On the product media, go to the top-level or root directory.
2. Extract one of the following files:  
**nnmi\_interactive\_installation\_en.zip**
3. Double-click **interactive\_installation\_upgrade\_guide\_en.htm**.
4. The NNMi Interactive Installation Guide enables you to select the installation or uninstallation options for your network environment. Select each option that applies.
