Recreating the tfs.ear File to Use Web Services API and Samples on WebSphere and WebLogic

If you wish to use the Web Services API or deploy the Web Services samples on the WebSphere and WebLogic application servers, perform the following steps to recreate the tfs.ear file after modifying its deployment descriptor. These steps assume you have set up the ant and java environments.

- 1. Navigate to the <SF-INSTALL-DIR>/sf_ear/ directory on your system.
- 2. Copy the <SF-SDK-CD>/docs/repackage-build.xml file to this directory.
- 3. Run the following command in the <SF-INSTALL-DIR>/sf_ear/ directory:

```
ant -buildfile repackage-build.xml un-pack
```

- 4. Open the <SF-INSTALL-DIR>/sf_ear/modified_ear/META-INF/application.xml file for editing.
- 5. Add the following lines before the </application> tag at the end of the file:

```
<module>
<web>
<web-uri>tfs-wsp.war</web-uri>
<context-root>tfs-wsp</context-root>
</web>
</module>
```

- 6. Save and Close the file.
- 7. Run the following command in the <SF-INSTALL-DIR>/sf_ear/ directory:

ant -buildfile repackage-build.xml re-pack

8. Un-deploy the existing tfs.ear file, then deploy the newly-created_tfs.ear file on your application server.
