1 Upgrading the HP Client Automation Administrator



This guide pertains only to HPCA Classic (component-based) installations. If you are migrating from a version 7.2x or 7.5x HPCA Core and Satellite environment, refer to the *HPCA Enterprise Edition Core and Satellite Migration Guide* for migration instructions.

Upgrade Instructions



An Agent upgrade will remove a previous version of the Administrator if one is installed on the device.

To upgrade the HPCA Administrator for Windows

- Install the new HPCA Administrator by running `setup.exe` from the `Configuration Server\management_infrastructure\administrator_workstation\win32` directory on the HP Client Automation installation media.

The existing HPCA Administrator files are replaced during the new installation. You do not need to remove these files prior to installation.

However, if you remove the previous Administrator, and then run `setup.exe`, the HPCA Administrator will install to the default directory:

```
SystemDrive:\Program Files\Hewlett-Packard\CM\Agent
```

See the "Administrator for Windows" chapter in the *HPCA Administrator User Guide* for detailed information about how to use the installation.

To upgrade the HPCA Administrator for Linux and Macintosh

- Install the new HPCA Administrator using `./install` from the correct operating system-specific directory in the

`Configuration Server\management_infrastructure\administrator_workstation` directory on the HP Client Automation installation media.

For example, for Red Hat Linux, use the installation media located in:

```
Configuration Server\management_infrastructure\administrator_workstation\linux
```

The existing HPCA Administrator files are replaced during the new installation. You do not need to remove these files prior to installation.

However, if you remove the previous Administrator, and then run `setup.exe`, the HPCA Administrator will install to the default directory: `/opt/HP/CM/Agent`.
